

June 2021 Child Protection Week Covid Lockdown continues....

Dear friends and supporters of Masazane Soup Kitchen,

As many as 10 million adults and nearly **three million children** experienced hunger in the past week in South Africa, and 2.5 million adults and 600,000 children were experiencing perpetual hunger, hunger every day or almost every day (Daily Maverick, 28th May 2021)

Mark Heywood penned an excellent article on the effects of Covid-19 (loss of employment, reduced household incomes and growing food insecurity) on children (see box, right).

And in this **Child Protection Week** (starting 29th May), his voice is alone.

The University of Cape Town's Children's Institute in their press release at the start of Child Protection Week, expressed their

"As I write, millions of South Africa's children are having their futures determined by the hunger they experience today and tomorrow. Their brains and digestive systems are being shaped by nutritional deprivation that, for many, will eventually manifest in poor school outcomes, non-communicable diseases and a life on the economic margins". extreme concern at the announced reduction of the value of the national Child Support Grant (CSG). "*The CSG was* already below the food poverty line – it couldn't provide a child with adequate nutrition... In relative terms, this is the first time since its introduction that the value of the CSG will fall relative to food price inflation." The bottom line is that the grant now buys even less food this year than it did last year. Some more stark facts (PMB Household Affordability Index):

- 1 in 7 households reported that a child went to bed hungry.
- 17% of adults said that their households experienced hunger.
- Food prices increased by 9.8% for the period Feb 2020 to Feb 2021, nearly double pre-pandemic levels.
- 40% said that their households ran out of money for food.
