

Dear friends and supporters of Masazane Soup Kitchen,

Our Chairperson Claudine Bill's report presented at our AGM in March is worth quoting from:

"2024 has been another busy year for the Masazane Soup Kitchen. Our wonderful team of gogos, ably supported by Martha Mdingi have continued to provide nutritious meals for the younger children of Mbekweni Primary School. Over 58 000 meals were served to children in Grade R to 3. This is no small feat, and we salute the gogos for their hard work.

The gogos not only provide nutritious food but also serve the children with love and care. The Daily Maverick article in Women's month noted the importance of women in the care economy saying that "the work of the food handlers extends beyond preparing food; their care work involves social interaction, emotional support and community building, all of which are essential for learners to feel engaged and motivated and develop a love for learning and school". This really encapsulates the work done at Masazane Soup Kitchen.



This year, the media has highlighted food safety, with the tragic deaths of children possibly related to food from Spaza shops. This has highlighted the need for vigilance in our kitchen, and I commend the team for maintaining good hygiene and food safety.



We undertook some major repairs this year, fixing the leaking roof and improving the drains. **Jacques Matthee** generously gave of his time and expertise to design and build an outdoor sink, to make the cleaning of the large pots easier for the gogos.

The network of support that underpins this project is quite remarkable. Most directly, is the support provided by **Shireen Willemse**. In her kind, caring way, she orders and delivers all the food, makes sure the electricity and gas are provided, and checks in with the team each week...

Our support network in Paarl includes the Bethel Congregational Church and the Mbekweni primary

School. The ongoing support of **Mr Michael Njenxa**, the principal, is valued, as he actively supports the kitchen, and allows a safe working environment for the gogos.

Next is the support that we receive from our wonderful, regular **donors**. They provide the backbone of the funds for the daily running of the kitchen, and <u>we are really</u> <u>grateful for this ongoing support</u>... We have some amazing supporters from around the world who respond to our needs. There are some generous individuals who have supported the repairs needed and the Christmas gifts for the children. I would also like to mention the Plymouth Congregational Church in Colorado USA whose annual Christmas pledge provides significant funds; the Cape of Good Hope Club of Soroptomist International; and the Rotary Club of Paarl for their donations.
